The only challenge I have currently is my age, I think, it's little too earlier to choose my field. Though I'll keep on playing this game.



Stereotypes affect how boys and girls see themselves and their roles within society. Opportunities are lost, passions are denied and potential unfilled because of the belief that 'it's not for someone like me'.

When I retired from sport I wanted to change this. I wrote and, Run Like A Girl, a book that features 50 true stories of female athletes from around the world, because representation matters. We need a space where we can see women succeeding,

thriving, failing, bouncing back, and testing the limits of human endurance to change perceptions and rewrite harmful narratives. There are so many fierce competitors, comeback queens, trailblazers, thrill seekers, change makers and barrier breakers who deserve to have their story told - and the young people who deserve to hear from them.

My dream is to use stories and inspiring role models to support the next generation. We can all achieve incredible things if we are given the right opportunity and, for me, the biggest privilege of being a Paralympian is getting to put something back.
