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
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
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
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
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


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
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




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Shayla Hutton



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For most artists in New York City, it is usually hard to catch that first big break. For Canadian citizen Shayla Hutton, she has been fulfilling her dreams for the last 10 years as a contemporary/ballet dancer.

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
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From a young age, Hutton knew she wanted to dance. The British Columbia native was enrolled in lessons from the age of 3 where she studied intensively at The Canadian School of Ballet. "My family and teachers really supported me," Hutton says. "As I got older, my teachers helped me find opportunities near where we lived to help me reach my goal. For instance, my high school had a huge impact on my development as an artist." Hutton is a notable graduate from Kelowna Secondary School and was the only female recipient awarded a scholarship to continue her education in the arts. She also was chosen for the Canadian College of Performing Arts. "From there, I really knew that I wanted to move to New York City and become a professional dancer". Throughout the summers between her high school years, Hutton was selected for prestigious summer programs at the National Ballet of Canada, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Banff Performing Arts and the Okanagan Summer Dance Intensive. She also was selected to dance with the Moscow Ballet in Kelowna and performed a Leading Role at the British Columbia Children's Winter Games, all while completing her Royal Academy of Dance to the Advanced 2 level. She believes her success during this time helped set her up to eventually work in New York City permanently. "Dance is a really competitive field," she says. "It was really important for me to get into those programs during high school - my training at home helped prepare me for that. I think it really helped my chances to get into a post-secondary program later on".

After graduating from high school in 2012, Hutton trained and performed with the Joffrey Ballet School for 4 years. Her talents have brought her to different stages across the United States, as well as internationally in Florence, Italy and in Toronto, Canada. Hutton currently is dancing with the established dance company Nimbus Dance (Jersey City, NJ). Hutton has been personally asked to perform in lead roles with the company, including choreography by Samuel Pott (Artistic Director of Nimbus Dance), the late Gerald Arpino, Davis Robertson (Artistic Director and Founder of New York Dance Project), Tyler Gilstrap, Kristen Klein (Artistic Director of Inclined Dance Project) and Yoshito Sakuraba (Artistic Director of Abarukas Dance). "I am so grateful for all the wonderful teachers and training I received in New York over the past years. I have learned so much and am a better artist and person because of them." Hutton is excited to be continuing her career as a professional contemporary/ballet dancer.


